



Structural barriers-Lessons learnt

Staff

- Small number of staff working in drug treatment and prevention in Greece (less than 2.000)
- Lack of new staff recruitments
- Small term contracts

Training

- Lack of undergraduate programmes in university curricula (no fees)
- Very few university professors currently teaching the subject (less than 5)
- Minimal prospects for new teaching staff
- Lack of Professional Certification recognized in Greek State

Researc h

- Very few Doctoral Thesis in Greek Universities the last 15 years (less than 5)
- No research funds
