Context

In many countries the drug problem is not visible, nor has it been considered a priority.

The promotion of measures against drug abuse must be planned taking into account the political and socioeconomic realities of these countries.







Context

Political advocacy is a **broad process in the** sense that its objective is to modify public policies to benefit the interests of groups of citizens, not only in the political aspect, but in different areas of public action: economic, social and services.

It could be said that political advocacy is the efforts of the organized community to influence the formulation and implementation of public policies and programs, through persuasion and pressure on authorities or other institutions of public power.

Using the mass media to express opinions on current issues, among others.




Problem: Low priority for prevention programs
