- Prevention science identifies the determinants of behaviors that protect or put at risk the social, emotional, and physical health of individuals, families, communities; the processes as to how these determinants operate; and the strategies that effectively intervene when trajectories are negative and reinforce those trajectories that are positive.
- Evidence-based practices or interventions are the systematic application of processes or services that have been shown, through available scientific evidence, to consistently improve measurable outcomes.

What is a Culture of Prevention?

- •Understanding of the etiology or "cause" of the problem and that there are effective responses to address or mediate the potential negative trajectories in the case of vulnerability or to reinforce positive actions that are anticipated to lead to positive outcomes.
- •It is a belief that prevention "works," a belief that is so strong that efforts are made to support prevention efforts in a variety of settings and around a variety of issues.




