Abstract

This study was conducted using a sample of 350 British respondents on alcohol consumption habits among respondents in London.

Objective: The main objective identified in the study is to explore British people's drinking patterns and to present specific implications for alcohol policy support.

Methods: The methodology used in the study was quantitative research, as the researcher administered questionnaires to participants via email. The questionnaires consisted of adequately constructed questions aimed at exploring drinking patterns among participants.

Results: The data retrieved from participants were analysed using SPSS software. Results represent statistically significant relationships were found among the set of variables identified in the methodology section of the study. The variables that represented the most relevant findings included frequency of drinking alcohol at home and consumption of alcohol in the workplace. In addition, the variable of religion demonstrated statistically significant results considering that a significant portion of the sample is constituted of Muslims (40%). Such an aspect has had a profound impact on research findings because of specific limitations on alcohol consumptions as imposed by the respective religion.

Conclusion: One of the main conclusions demonstrated in the study is that British consumers of alcoholic beverages generally tend to have a high drinking rate. The high rate of British alcohol consumers has implications for alcohol policy support.

The aim of this review is to analyze the trend of using Virtual Reality (VR) in addiction treatment by categorizing the types of addictions and methods of Virtual Reality Therapy (VRT) for substance use disorders. VR has been utilized as a new paradigm for treating various mental and psychological problems. In recent years, a number of researches have been done to demonstrate the effectiveness of VRT for addiction treatment, specifically substance use disorders. In order to comprehend the tendency of these researches, the current study performed a systematic review of published book and journal articles using the following bibliographical databases: ScienceDirect, MEDLINE, ProQuest, and Em base. Forty-five (45) articles were retrieved; out of these researches, nicotine/smoking has garnered the highest number of studies (73%, n=33); alcohol (18%, n=8); cannabis/marijuana (2%, n=1); and other drugs such as heroin, cocaine and methamphetamine (7%, n=3). This paper analyzed the results of those studies, found some limitations as well as strengths, and made suggestions for further research on VRT for addiction treatment.

Objectives

Currently, time of alcohol purchase is not part of the policies to regulate alcohol consumption in South Korea. This study was conducted to determine the relationship between alcohol purchasing time and alcohol use disorder.

Methods

The survey for this study was conducted in geographically diverse regions of South Korea in 2012. Respondents' purchasing behaviors for both on-licensed (i.e., allows for consumption within the premises) and off-licensed (i.e., where alcohol is consumed off the premises) outlets and time of alcohol consumption were collected. Alcohol consumption patterns were examined using the Rapid Alcohol Problem Screen 4 (RAPS4). Data were also analyzed by age, gender and purchasing time.

Results

Results showed that among the off-licensed premises, supermarkets appear to be the most popular venue while for on-licensed premises; alcohol was generally consumed inside hotels/pubs regardless of age and gender of the purchaser. Purchasing of alcohol was highest during the day and early evening period (9:00 a.m. to 9:59 p.m.). Females are most likely to abuse alcohol than males during the early morning period and is that period after 12:00 midnight.

Conclusion

Analysis suggests that the survey instrument used in the International Alcohol Control Study is being used to collect data on alcohol purchasing time consumption; therefore, the potential is there to provide accurate results to contribute appropriate policy responses to reduce alcohol related-harm.

Abstract

Stress-related problems associated with lifestyle are increasing among Filipino adolescents. Middle school and high school students have been identified as the most vulnerable groups being linked to incidence of chronic diseases and high risk of engagement to negative behaviors. This study aimed to (1) identify the perceived stress between male and female subjects, (2) identify the lifestyle choices between male and female subjects, and (3) determine the relationship of perceived stress and lifestyle choices among adolescents in the Philippines. Standardized questionnaires were used in conducting this study and subjects included 504 adolescents from grade eighth (N=286) and tenth (N=218) students of Sta. Lucia High School. The between group analyses revealed a significant relationship of perceived stress to lifestyle choices of the Filipino adolescents. The results showed that females have a lower perceived stress and chose healthier lifestyle than males. In regression analyses, the correlations between perceived stress and lifestyle choices have significance in the positive items of Perceived Stress Scale (PSS) as the dependent variables of Healthy Lifestyle Personal Control questionnaire (HLPCQ). Female subjects were able to significantly control and manage perceived stress even when exposed to various stressors compared to their male counterparts as well as having healthier lifestyle choices. Perceived stress level of Filipino adolescents has a significant relation to their lifestyle choices. Findings of the study highlight the need to develop and have a proper implementation of school-based healthy lifestyle programs and prevention measures among adolescents.
