



Congratulations to the 31 professionals from Doha, Qatar who participated in the ICAP exams on December 11, 2024

A special congratulations to the candidates from Qatar : **17 candidates** who earned the **ICAP I Credential**. This milestone reflects your dedication and commitment to professional growth in the field of addiction treatment and prevention.

This examination was conducted in collaboration with and sponsored by NAUFAR in Doha, Qatar and represents an important step toward advancing the professionalism of the addiction workforce in the region. We applaud your hard work and look forward to your continued success!

ICAP Examinations in Manila, Philippines

On January 17, 2025, CCA successfully conducted the ICAP Treatment and Prevention examinations at Novotel Manila Araneta City, <u>Manila, Philippines.</u>

The examination session included a total of 32 candidates who participated in the various ICAP certifications, with the following breakdown: 1 candidate for ICAP Treatment I, 20 candidates for ICAP Treatment II, 7 candidates for ICAP Treatment III, 2 candidates for ICAP Treatment IV, and 2 candidates for ICAP Prevention.

This important event was held in collaboration with the Department of Health, Philippines, and the Colombo Plan Drug Advisory Programme, marking another successful partnership in the ongoing efforts to professionalize the drug demand reduction workforce in the region.

CCA is pleased with the outcomes of the examination session and looks forward to further collaboration to expand credentialing opportunities for professionals in the field of drug prevention, treatment, and recovery support.

We extend our gratitude to all participants and partners for their continued support in advancing these essential initiatives.

Online Remote-Proctored Exams

In January 2025, CCA registered a total of 39 candidates from 14 countries for the ICAP Treatment I & II remoteproctored examinations. The candidates represent a diverse range of countries, including Botswana (1), Bangladesh (1), Canada (1), India (1), Indonesia (3), Nigeria (1), Philippines (2), Qatar (2), South Africa (1), South Korea (1), Sri Lanka (1), United Arab Emirates (3), Uruguay (1), and Vietnam (20).

In addition to English, candidates will have the opportunity to take their exams in Arabic, Bahasa Indonesia, Bengali, Burmese, Dari, French, Mongolian, Pashto, Portuguese, Russian, Thai, Urdu and Vietnamese, ensuring accessibility for non-English speakers and enhancing inclusivity.

The flexibility offered by ICAP remote-proctored examinations, allowing candidates to apply, register, and take the exams at a time and date of their choice, has contributed to their growing popularity among addiction professionals worldwide.

Center Update: Center for Credentialing and Accreditation



Renew Your Credential Online!

The ICAP-renewal application is now available on the application portal, providing a streamlined process for professionals to renew their International Certified Addiction Professional (ICAP) credentials. To renew, users need to log in to the portal, select their existing credential, and update their contact information. The application requires evidence of career progression and continuing education or training undertaken in the past three years. This renewal process ensures that professionals maintain their certification and stay current with industry standards.

ICAP Awareness Survey: Insights and Next Steps

We have officially concluded and summarized the ICAP Awareness Survey. The survey assessed awareness, accessibility, and perceived value of the ICAP credential among key stakeholders in drug demand reduction (DDR), including ISSUP, ICUDDR, ICUDDR-Center for Credentialing and Accreditation, the African Union, ASEAN, and CICAD. The survey revealed an overall 48.2% of our respondents being aware of the ICAP, indicating moderate familiarity with ICAP. Participants provided suggestions for improving awareness, such as leveraging social media for promotion, collaborating with universities and governments, reducing costs, emphasizing career benefits, and increasing accessibility through online testing and expanded exam centers. These findings will inform CCA's strategic planning to enhance ICAP's impact and adoption globally. Follow-up surveys for 2025 are planned in six months and a year to measure progress and refine strategies. Thank you once again for your input!

Advancing Global Prevention Initiatives: Standardization, Innovation, Cultural
